Background of the Centre

Immigration, integration, discrimination, racism and xenophobia have become central topics in different member countries of the EU. In Finland, too, we have seen public concern about these topics. Different Ministries, as well as regional and communal bodies, have taken an active part in the discussion, trying to improve their management of ethnic diversity.

A Working Group in the Ministry of Education suggested as early as 1991 the establishment of a Centre on Ethnic Research, but this did not materialise. In 1997 an overview of the research activities in this field was carried out at the Swedish School of Social Science, supported by a grant from the Finnish Academy of Science.

The Ministry of Education decided to financially support the establishment of the Centre for a two-year period (1999-2000) and the Rector of the University of Helsinki gave financial support for the development of the Centre during the same period. It was decided in the consultations with the Ministry that from 2001 onwards a permanent support for the administration of the Centre should be allocated to the budget of the School. This agreement has been fulfilled securing the future development of the Centre as a central institution for research and monitoring of Ethnic Relations in Finland.

In February 2004 the Swedish School for Social Science applied for an interdisciplinary pool professor in Ethnic relations from the University of Helsinki. The pool professor was appointed to CEREN in 2006. The establishment of The Master's Degree Programme in Ethnic Relations, Cultural Diversity and Integration (ERI) at the University of Helsinki has been one of the main tasks of the professor.

In September 2009 CEREN moved, along with the Swedish School of Social Science, to the new building located at Snellmaninkatu 12 in Kruununuhaka.

In 2010 CEREN was led by Director and Professor Peter A. Kraus. D.Soc.Sc. Docent Sirpa Wrede worked as the Research Coordinator and M.Soc.Sc. Heidi Aaltonen as the Research Administrator. In November B.Soc.Sc. Hanna-Maria Bärlund began as a substitute for Aaltonen during her maternity leave. M.Soc.Sc. Anna Storgårds worked as the Planning Officer of the Master's Degree Programme in Ethnic Relations, Cultural Diversity and Integration (ERI) which is coordinated from CEREN.

Activities of CEREN in 2010

1. RESEARCH PROJECTS AND PROGRAMMES

Transnational and Local: The Social Integration of Immigrant Communities

The research project provides new information about how local processes of integration relate to the transnational relations of immigrant communities. The project is motivated by the fact that in Finland there is a lack of information about the growing role of transnationalism among immigrant communities. The project studies the social integration of immigrant communities from a longitudinal perspective and also studies the growing role of new European-wide policies in immigrant integration projects. As a point of departure, the researchers contend that many contemporary processes of immigrant integration can be better understood if we study the processes of integration at the local level. This project is therefore interested in how contemporary immigrant integration processes are simultaneously both transnational and local, rather than strictly bounded by a national Finnish context. The project consists of a number of related and overlapping empirical studies.

Framing immigration and integration in changing journalism

Finnish journalists operate in an increasingly multi-ethnic environment, and that requires new skills. In addition, new technology and increased competition have recently changed journalism. One of such changes is an increase in opinionated journalism. This project analyses changes in immigration related opinionated journalism, like blogs, editorials, and columns, between 1990 and 2010. In addition, the project scrutinizes everyday journalistic work and editorial policies.

CEREN is part of a research consortium that was granted funding for the research project EUROSPHERE - Diversity and the European Public Sphere: Towards a Citizens' Europe within EU:s sixth framework programme. The project is coordinated by the research unit Unifob Global at the University of Bergen in Norway and it includes 16 partner universities. EUROSPHERE seeks to create innovative perspectives on the European public and to identify the conditions that enable or undermine the articulation of inclusive European public spheres. In year 2010 the collected data has been analysed and a EUROSPHERE mid-term conference was organised in Brussels.

Challenging Power: Equality, Diversity and the Integration of Ethnic and National Minorities in Finland

The Finnish welfare state is known for its commitment to participatory parity not only between men and women, but also between the majority population and ethno-cultural minorities. Nevertheless, equal participation does not take place in all spheres where power is exercised. This research project seeks new ways to understand power around ethnic relations and to reflect on how the commitment to equality could be realized in the Finnish context.

New research programme

Responding to Complex Diversity in Europe and Canada, RECODE

The Research Networking Programme Responding to Complex Diversity in Europe and Canada (RECODE) was launched in Strasbourg in May 2010. Peter A. Kraus is the Chair of the Programme, which involves 13 European countries and Canada. This interdisciplinary, comparative research programme is intended to explore to what extent the processes of transnationalisation, migration, religious mobilisation and cultural differentiation entail a new configuration of social conflict in post-industrial societies. Such a possible new constellation we here label complex diversity. The leading idea is that such diversity is developing at a global level, but particularly in European-style societies, where social entitlements, supranational policies and cultural diversity enjoy a considerable, but often contradictory degree of legitimacy. In this perspective, Canada offers some interesting similarities and contrasts with Europe. The project tries therefore to identify the cleavages and nonnative issues that this new constellation raises on both sides of the Atlantic, and to develop expertise in the institutions, public policies and cultural resources that can respond to them. The thematic focus of the programme covers the areas of linguistic diversity and political communication, religious pluralism, transnationalism and, finally, multiculturalism and welfare state policies. During the four year period eight workshops and one summer school for PhD students will be organized. The inaugural conference and workshop are scheduled to take place at the University of Helsinki in May 2011.

2. EDUCATION

The Master's Degree Programme in Ethnic Relations, Cultural Diversity and Integration (ERI)

The Master's Degree Programme in Ethnic Relations, Cultural Diversity and Integration (ERI) is an interdisciplinary 2-year programme in English offered by the Swedish School of Social Science, the Department of Social Research, and the Department of Political and Economic Studies. ERI offers three major subjects: Political Science (with two subprogrammes: Politics or Administration and Organizations) Sociology and Social Psychology.

Admission of students

The third group of ERI students began their studies in autumn 2010. Eleven candidates were selected out of 114 applicants. As three did not accept their study place and one postponed the start of the studies, there were eight students who started their studies in autumn. This year there

were no internal applicants from UH. The new students come from the US, France, Romania, Sweden, Nigeria, the Philippines and Finland.

Developing teaching in ERI

The cooperation with the participating disciplines continued during 2010 and students attended courses organized jointly with other MA programmes at the Faculty.

The ERI Lecture Pass was introduced at the beginning of the year. The pass is linked to the monthly CEREN colloquiums. Students who actively take part in the colloquiums and submit lecture diaries are awarded 2/4 study points. The aim of the lecture pass is to further develop the cooperation and networking between CEREN and ERI.

Students were also offered a new thematic course, *Integration processes from a cross-disciplinary perspective*, taught by Pasi Saukkonen. The course was partly developed as a result of feedback from the ERI students in 2009.

Work life connections

The first ERI Work life session was organized in spring 2010. Students visited the Department for Immigration Affairs of the City of Helsinki as guests of Director Annika Forsander. The group was informed about the activities of the Department and got some advice about which skills are important when working at such a unit.

In addition, the ERI programme participated in the VALOA project. The project aims at creating concrete tools and forms of action and guidance for employers and universities so that international expertise will be retained in Finland. It is financed by the University of Helsinki, the Cities of Helsinki and Oulu and ESR. Six ERI students took part in the pilot phase. They were sent out to various companies to carry out small scale research regarding internationalization.

First ERI graduation

Kristiina Mauriala is the first graduate from the ERI programme. Kristiina started her ERI studies in 2008, when the programme was launched. She completed the programme within the target time of 2 years. Her thesis is titled *The impact of EU membership conditionality on minority protection in Estonia*.

3. TRAINING

PhD Training

Nordic Migration Research Training Course 2010

In late May and early June, the Swedish School of Social Science and CEREN hosted a one week Nordic Migration Research training course for PhD candidates. Coordinated by University Lecturer Östen Wahlbeck, the theme of the course was Immigrant Integration and Social Theory in the Nordic context, covering research about the integration of immigrants and their various experiences in the Nordic countries as well as how the societal processes related to immigration can be understood with the help of theories of integration and assimilation. The course was organised by the Swedish School of Social Science at the University of Helsinki (SSKH), the Centre for Research on Ethnic Relations and Nationalism (CEREN), the Swedish Imerförbundet, the association Nordic Migration Research (NMR) and was funded by NordForsk. The course took place from May 28th to June 2nd at the Swedish School of Social Science, with 21 PhD students taking part and originating from universities in Iceland, Norway, Sweden and Finland. There were also visiting lecturers from the Nordic countries and the United States, including Professor Peter Kivisto, Dr. Marko Valenta, Professor Mikko Lagerspetz, Dr. Garbi Schmidt, Dr. Hassan Hosseini-Kaladjahi, Dr. Tuomas Martikainen, as well as Dr. Kathleen Valtonen, Professor Peter A. Kraus and Dr. Östen Wahlbeck from the University of Helsinki. The course programme consisted of morning lectures followed by afternoon paper presentations by the students who received comments from both a fellow student and one of the lecturers.

4. SEMINARS, CONFERENCES AND EVENTS

Seminar

Strangers in Work: the Ethnification of Inequality in Finnish Working Life

An afternoon seminar "Strangers in Work: The Ethnification of Inequality in Finnish Working Life" was held on the 16th of June 2010 to celebrate the publishing of the book "Vieraita työssä. Työelämän etnistyvä eriarvoisuus" (Gaudeamus 2010). The seminar and the book report the results of the CEREN project "The position of immigrants in Finnish working life" (2006-2008) that was funded by the Finnish Work Environment Fund. This project was originally led by the former CEREN researcher, Docent Annika Forsander. After her move to the position of Director of Immigration Affairs for the City of Helsinki, the project was completed by Docent Sirpa Wrede. Also, Rolle Alho, Suvi Linnanmäki and Jeannette Laurén have worked within the project. The programme of the June seminar included presentations by Östen Wahlbeck, Akhlaq Ahmad, Rolle Alho, Olga Silfver, and Camilla Haavisto. Joint presentations were given by Markus Himanen and Jukka Könönen and Susanna Bairoh and Marja-Liisa Trux, respectively. The seminar attracted more than 40 participants and was organised and chaired by Sirpa Wrede and Camilla Nordberg.

Seminar

Study Group: Glocalisation

CEREN's Research Coordinator Dr. Sirpa Wrede and Dr. Camilla Nordberg organized two research seminars in connection to the Glocalisation study group. One of the seminars was held in October 2010 with the title *Subjectivity, Identity and Belonging in Glocalising Workworlds*. Invited speakers included Dr. Vanessa May, Dr. Lena Näre and Ph.D. Candidate Tricia Cleland. The second seminar was held in December and focused on migration and citizenship with the title *Migration and Citizenship in the Glocalising Welfare State*. However, due to a snowstorm and other practical troubles, part of the seminar was cancelled or postponed until January 2011. The programme included presentations from Vice Rector Elianne Riska (Swedish School of Social Science) and Dr. Gerard Boucher (University of West Scotland). In addition, the study group has regularly organized study evenings during the autumn 2010, which have gathered participants from several different disciplines as well as from other universities.

Events

ERI Day 2010 – The Politics of Diversity

On the 28th of October, the Master's Degree Program in Ethnic Relations, Cultural Diversity and Integration (ERI) together with the Centre for Research on Ethnic Relations and Nationalism (CEREN) organized a kick-off event for the ERI Master's Program. An occasion to celebrate three years of the program's existence, the ERI Day 2010 took the form of a seminar dedicated to the theme of *Politics of Diversity*. The scope of topics being discussed ranged from issues of multiculturalism in Nordic societies to the challenges of immigration in Finland.

The seminar was opened by the Rector of the Swedish School of Social Sciences Henrik Hägglund and Professor Peter A. Kraus (CEREN). Keynote speakers were Thomas Hylland Eriksen, University of Oslo and Pasi Saukkonen, University of Helsinki. The theme of the panel discussion was "Challenges of Immigration in Finland" and panelists were Minister Astrid Thors, Marja Tiilikainen (UH), Inga Jaskinskaja-Lahti (UH) and Kathleen Valtonen (UH, CEREN). Peter Kraus (UH, CEREN) chaired the session.

CEREN Research Colloquium

CEREN started a Research Colloquium in autumn 2006. The aim of the Research Colloquium is to provide a forum where researchers have a possibility to present their research and discuss their topics with research colleagues. 5. NATIONAL COOPERATION

ETMU - The Society for the Study of Ethnic Relations and International Migration

In 1998 the Social Science Research Council of the Academy arranged a working seminar concerning the Academy's role in support of research in this field. In 1999 the activities led to the a Research Programme on *Equality, Marginalization and Ethnic Relation, Syreeni*, in 2000-2003 which engaged more than 50 researchers and doctoral students in the field. This again led to the founding of an association for the studies of Ethnic Relations and International Migration (ETMU) in Finland. CEREN has played an active part in all these activities. It is a multidisciplinary association of Finnish researchers to promote research in this field in Finland. To further this aim, the Society arranges conferences and edits scientific publications covering this sphere of interest. The Finnish Journal of Ethnicity and Migration (FJEM) is a scholarly and professional journal, published by ETMU. It aims to promote and advance the circulation of the multidisciplinary study of ethnic relations and international migration that is conducted in Finland and its neighbourhood, especially the other Nordic countries. The Journal is trilingual (English, Finnish, Swedish) and published twice a year. Camilla Nordberg belongs to the editorial board of FJEM.

6. INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

Migra-Nord Network - Nordic Research Network for Media, Migration and Society

Migra-Nord network completed its three year Nordforsk researcher network -project in 2010. The project period was very successful in establishing a new interdisciplinary research field of media and migration in the Nordic countries. The network continues to disseminate ideas and information through its emailing list, which brings together more than 100 Nordic academics. New research projects and publications are currently beginning.

In 2010 several international seminars were organized such as the *Media in Motion – Book Seminar*, which was held at the University of Tampere, and the *Nordic Seminar: Mediation of cultural complexity and migration* which included presentations of Nordic research and book projects as well as workshop sessions, and was held at the Swedish School of Social Science. International guest speakers were invited to the seminar, including professor André Jansson from Karlstad University, professor Radha Hegde from New York University as well as professor Annabelle Sreberny from the University of London.

The Migra-Nord Network has gathered more than 90 junior and senior academics working in the interdisciplinary field of media, migration and ethnic relations in the Nordic countries, particularly in Sweden, Denmark, Norway and Finland. Now the Network includes doctoral students also from Iceland, Estonia and Lithuania. The Network was coordinated and directed by Docent Karina Horsti at CEREN.

Nordic Migration Research association

CEREN is represented in the Nordic Migration Research association board by Dr. Karina Horsti and Dr. Camilla Nordberg. The association received a Nordforsk researcher network grant for 2008 - 2011. Activities include doctoral training, organising a Nordic conference for migration researchers, and publishing a peer-reviewed international journal *Nordic Journal of Migration Research*.

IMISCOE research network

CEREN is a member of the research network IMISCOE (International Migration, Integration and Social Cohesion). The aim is that by being a member in the network CEREN would promote the research field within the whole University of Helsinki. CEREN's representatives as institutional members during 2010 were Professor Peter A. Kraus, D.Soc.Sc. Docent Sirpa Wrede and D.Soc.Sc. Docent Östen Wahlbeck.
